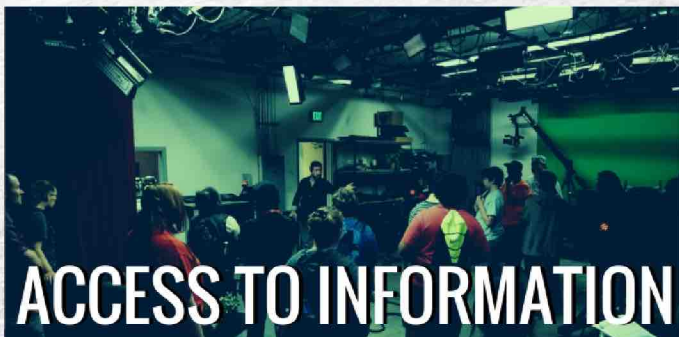

ACCESS TO INFORMATION

A well-informed, actively-involved citizenry makes more responsible decisions. CCTV televises local government meetings, activities of local schools, and service-related information to stimulate an active dialogue among elected officials, schools, and local citizens.

All people in a democracy have the right and responsibility to take part in the decisions that affect them and their communities. Freedom of speech is vital to a healthy democracy and is guaranteed in the First Amendment. CCTV provides the community with the opportunity for political, cultural, artistic, spiritual, and individual expression on television.

DIVERSITY & INCLUSION

Democracy is most effective in a society in which all members can participate. CCTV encourages understanding and collaboration across barriers of race, culture, language, class, gender and age.

Community TV offers an alternative to commercial television. CCTV provides the training and tools necessary for people to become knowledgeable and effective communicators, able to view television critically and to use that medium to tell their own stories.



COMMUNITY DECISION-MAKING

Freedom of expression alone is not enough to ensure a healthy democracy. Citizens must also enter into active discussion and debate in order to participate in solving problems for the common good. CCTV promotes the use of non-commercial channels 21, 22, 23 and production facilities as an electronic forum for discussing issues and solving problems.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT: **OUR COMMUNITY IS IMPORTANT**

If it's important to you, it's important to us.

Building on our history and support from the City of Salem and Marion County, CCTV continues to help local governments, schools, non-profit organizations and individuals connect with this community. Here's a look at a key new role for CCTV and a peek at what's ahead.

Joint Information Center (JIC), PrepareFair and Scout the Wonderdog

CCTV is working with the City of Salem and Marion County in the Mid-Willamette Emergency Communications Collective to make sure that our community has accurate and timely information in the event of emergencies. Salem Health, the Red Cross and other aid agencies have joined the collective to help advance our community's preparedness.

The first test is Salem Eclipse 2017. An unprecedented 750,000 to 1,000,000 people will visit Oregon for this uncommon event. CCTV plans live coverage in addition to serving as a Joint Information Center. The event will provide a unique opportunity to test emergency information gathering and distribution at a time with no natural or manmade disaster.

CCTV worked with the same collective on the first annual PrepareFair in April. More than 300 people participated at North Salem in an event designed to help people prepare for disaster, with earthquakes being the most prominent and most destructive. In the process, CCTV met Martha Allen and Scout, her "wonderdog" who has been terrific in promoting participation.

New in 2017-2018

In 2018, CCTV expects to launch its first HD channel. Expect a substantial campaign as we deliver to you the same terrific signal we see in our production monitors.

Is it your turn in 2017-2018? Are you the next one to step up and connect with more of your friends and neighbors? CCTV is here to help!

Our thanks to you!

We again thank this community and our terrific volunteers for our first 25 plus years. Our community has shown that we can connect with each other and can celebrate what we have in common and how we differ.

AUG 2016

In August, CCTV visited Gilbert House Children's Museum to participate in Salem's 3rd Annual Mini Maker Faire. Children learned the magic of green screen technology while creating their own stories!

JULY 2016

CCTV kicked off July with Summer Video Camp. Three weeks and a film festival later, campers said goodbye, but the festivities were far from over. July ended with CCTV's annual Volunteer Recognition party.



OCT 2016

October was filled with coverage of local high school and college football games. CCTV recorded and broadcast almost 20 games this season!

SEPT 2016

CCTV partnered with League of Women Voters in September to create Video Voter Guides for the upcoming elections. Local and State candidates were invited to CCTV's studios for forums and platform statements.



NOV 2016

True to CCTV tradition, November bustled with activity during CCTV's non-profit holiday greetings. Over the course of 2 weeks, CCTV hosted 67 non-profit organizations, all of whom created a festive holiday message to play on CCTV's channels.

DEC 2016

Santa visited CCTV's studio in December, taking calls and granting Christmas wishes live on Channel 22.





JAN 2017

January began with the swearing-in ceremony for Salem's City Council, followed by CCTV's coverage of audience reactions at the local TEDx event. Ending the month with a bang, our community gathered at the Capitol for the Women's March on Washington, which was recorded and played on Channel 21 for those who couldn't attend.

FEB 2017

In February, CCTV saw its biggest orientation class of the year, with over 30 new community members in attendance!



MAR 2017

CCTV was active in the community in March, participating in outreach events at both Salem's Public Library for "Ask the Experts", and at Gilbert House Children's Museum for another green screen activity. March also meant a trek up to Portland to record Salem's basketball teams competing in OSAA State Championships.

APRIL 2017

CCTV TRAINING

Camera This introductory course teaches students how to operate CCTV's high-definition camcorders that are available for checkout. The class covers basic shooting practices and using a tripod.

Edit A two-hour course for beginning editors in Final Cut Pro X editing software. The class walks students through many of the basic software features, giving editors the tools they need to finish their first program..

Studio Students learn how to make a program in CCTV's studios from start to finish. Training includes operation of studio cameras, audio mixing, directing, creating graphics, lighting a set and more.

THIS JULY, CCTV was taken over for three weeks by staff member Phillip DeRobertis and twelve enthusiastic filmmakers, aged 9 to 14 years old, for our annual Summer Video Camp (SVC). Each week of SVC had a different theme: week one taught the basics of camera function and shot composition, week two was a study in animation, and week three was a culmination of skills learned, concluding with a film festival and ice cream party on July 29th.

are encouraged to work together to create a handful of short films that reflect their personalities and what they are interested in. Among the highlights from this

year was *Aaron Unchained*, a story about a man and his unrelenting search for his stolen puppet.

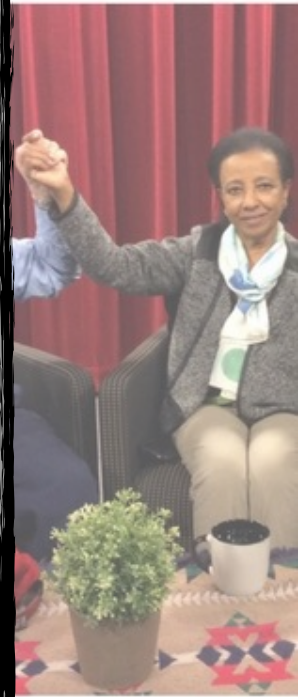

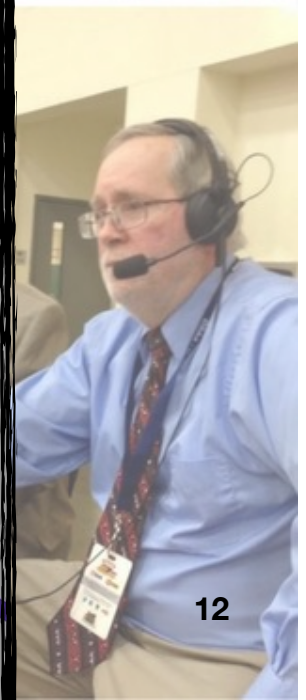

InSight Tracks Non-Profit News

Guests on InSight are selected not just because they can talk about success stories, but also changes. When there is news, InSight wants you to know about it.

This year, Mid-Valley Literacy Center moved to a new location at East Salem Community Center to accommodate growing programs. Salem Art Association expanded its Community Arts programs. Oregon State Capital Foundation reached a diverse audience with year-round events, and Salem Health previewed its new rehabilitation center on television, giving InSight producer Wendy Brokaw a chance to show viewers around and talk to staff. Plans were made to cover the opening of the new therapy playground, "Let's All Play Place" later in the year.

Co-hosts Mary Louise VanNatta and Ross Sutherland each bring unique style and substance to InSight, now entering its 4th year. Non-profits make a difference in the lives of our community, and the CCTV InSight hosts enjoy sitting on a living room set talking to them about what they do, and how people watching can help.



Riding Blind, Riding Safe: Taking the Fear out of Bus Travel



For blind and sight-impaired, an independent life includes mastering the fixed route bus system to feel safe and confident using it. But even the smallest disorientation can jeopardize safety, making bus travel for many not worth the risk. Blindsight, Inc., determined to empower those with vision challenges, sought help from Cherriots, the local transit center, and CCTV. The result was "Riding Blind, Riding Safe: a Cherriots Guide to Getting Around Town." Each of these five videos was created using actual Cherriots bus drivers, trainers and transit staff. Blind and sight-impaired passengers played themselves. All gave candid, often moving interviews in-studio for the opening video "But You Don't Look Blind." Series producer Wendy Brokaw was delighted to watch as Lisa Carignan, Cherriots trainer, and Marja Byers, Blindsight Executive Director, quickly learned how to storyboard, direct, and consult during editing on the videos which are now used for driver training and for a wide audience of blind and sight-impaired who can access each video online.

"What started out as a concept," said Cherriots driver trainer Al Bathke, "has taken on an excellent reality and finished product and will be so useful for teaching our transit operators (and others) on how to recognize and provide useful service to those who have varying degrees of sight impairment." Blindsight and Cherriots each host it on their own web sites. Blindsight, Inc. has made it available across the country through their national organization.

Holiday Greetings 2016

We at CCTV have to tip our hats to this non-profit community of ours. We are amazed yet again what people can create when given the brief opportunity to say "Thank You!" and "Happy Holidays!" to all those they serve.

The 2016 Non-Profit Holiday Greetings was bustling as 67 non-profits brought their staff and volunteers in-studio to make messages, knowing soon they would see themselves on CCTV's channels, YouTube, and social media.

They brought cats and dogs, props and instruments. Groups talked and sang and performed music. Police and Sheriff department officers are now experts at parking their squad cars and motorcycles in studio, this year having kids and canine officers to help deliver holiday safety tips.

Everyone spent time looking out the studio "windows", complete with falling snow created just for the occasion by CCTV's IT specialist Mike Wilhelm.

Congratulations on a job well done to all those who participated in this year's holiday greetings!

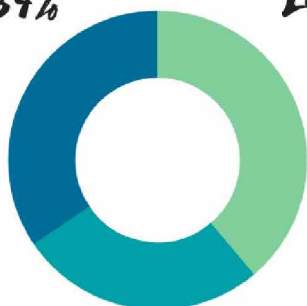
